

Health Article

How Important is Water for Your Health?

After the air (specifically oxygen) that you breathe, the next most important nutrient that your body needs is WATER! A friend was admitted to a hospital recently, and the doctor identified his problem as Dehydration (lack of water). He was put on a liquid drip; and I guess it cost him a fair amount of money to stay one night at the private hospital.

Dr F. Batmanhelidj wrote a book (You're Not Sick, You're Thirsty) of his experiences in reversing numerous medical conditions by just getting the person to drink more water. How much water? - Your body needs a minimum of 8 to 10 glasses of water a day.

Tips on making sure you have sufficient water:

- 1. Drink **30 minutes before eating** (especially for people with gastritis, peptic ulcer, heartburn, and gas-producing indigestion).
- 2. Take **two and a half hours after a meal** (to complete the digestion process).
- 3. Consume **2** glasses of water first thing in the morning to balance the dehydration during your long sleep.
- 4. Take **before exercising** (so that you have water for your sweat).
- 5. Drink anytime you are thirsty (even during meals).
- 6. Consume the 8 to 10 glasses continuously throughout the day.

Below is a regular column by Mr T E Tan on the various interesting peculiarities of the Japanese language

YOKATTA (GOOD! HOW LUCKY!! WHAT A RELIEF!!) 良かった

We young Malaysian government officers who were sent to Japan by Dr Mahathir under the "Look East Policy" were lucky to receive our living and transport allowances in the form of payment directly into our bank accounts.

Once a young Malaysian officer withdrew his whole month's allowances of about ¥80,000 and kept it in his wallet.

The next day we were supposed to go on a factory visit. After hopping out of the connecting bus at the train terminal, we were expected to buy our own train tickets. To his horror, he couldn't find his wallet. Everyone could see that he was on the verge of tears.



After coming back from the factory visit, the kind AOTS training coordinator brought the distraught young Malaysian to the bus company's lost and found department. To cut a long story short, he was overjoyed to get back his wallet with all the monies still intact.

Whenever the young Malaysian's story was repeated, without fail, the Japanese would exclaim "YOKATTA!" meaning "Good!" or "How lucky of you!!" or "Thank God!!".

If you suddenly remember that you have left your umbrella somewhere and when found it, you can exclaim "Ah Yokatta!", meaning "Ah I am so lucky!"

If your company successfully clinched a business deal, you can impress your superior by saying "Yokatta ne!", meaning "Isn't it lucky of us?" When we use the word "ne", we are gently seeking some form of agreement from the listener – in this case, that we are lucky. Most likely your superior will beam with a reply "So da na...", meaning "Yes, it's good".
