




# 36<sup>th</sup> AGM - HON. GEN. SECRETARY, DR. WONG KAM SUN, STEPHEN

## 35TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - HON. GEN. SECRETARY, DR. WONG KAM SUN, STEPHEN





n spite of the Covid-19, the 35<sup>th</sup> AGM of PAAM was successfully held in the afternoon of Sunday, 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2020 with overwhelming attendance of 38 PAAM members, far exceeded the quorum of 26. The outgoing President, Mr. Tan Teng Ek opened the meeting with a shocker statement: that PAAM Malaysia has the higher aging membership among the Alumni in ASEAN, with 75% of members above the age of 50 years old. He advised the incoming Central Committee to organize activities more appropriate to attract younger members before we become extinct.

The annual report was presented, and after due explanation to clarify some questions pertaining to the conduct of the Japanese classes for members, the yet empty Second floor of the office premise and AOTS Convention in Japan was then passed accordingly.

Similarly, the audited accounts for year 2019 was presented and passed accordingly. It was recommended that big account items be accompanied with notes for some detail explanation in the future.

Seven proposed amendments to the Constitution were presented and opened for members to discuss. These amendments were mainly focused on the memberships – life membership and ordinary membership. The amendments were proposed to address the discrepant power of the different type of memberships. Some discussions followed this topic of membership amendments before it was decided to be put to a vote to the floor. The other amendment concerned the differential in time call of half-an- hour on the same day for the adjourned AGM should there be a shortage of quorum for an AGM. This was to ensure that members' time, money and efforts be not wasted. When no further query was made and upon the suggestion of the outgoing President, with the acceptance by the floor that the members of the floor vote only once for all the amendments enbloc to be accepted or rejected by a simple majority, the vote was then cast by show of hand. The votes by hands were cast and counted twice by the two scrutinizers, these proposed constitutional amendments were passed by a majority of 26 votes for, and 4 votes against. The motion to pass the all the seven amendments was then carried.

Next, the election for the Central Committee for the term 2020 - 2022 was called and presided by the election chairman, Ms. Lee Sin Peng proposed from the floor. The results confirmed the new CCM as follows:

The resolution of the 15<sup>th</sup> FOSAAS Convention towards Sustainable Development and Partnership in the New Normal was agreed and adopted. President Son Seng Huat from AASC Cambodia was elected as the next Chairman (2021-2023) and he had cordially invited PAAM members to Cambodia for the next FOSAAS meeting which will be sometime in 2023.





## VISIT TO SEERS BERHAD ON 5<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER 2021
